

CONGRATULATIONS, TAVIUS ROBINSON ON BEING DRAFTED TO THE NFL!

Tavius, a Guelph native played for the Gryphons in 2018 and 2019, and then headed to Ole Miss in 2020. On Saturday, April 29th he was drafted in the 4th round, 124th pick to the Baltimore Ravens. <u>Tavius is the first University of Guelph player</u> to ever be drafted to the NFL.




East-West Bowl Invitations

"Growing up in Guelph, I would often watch many of the Gryphon Football games as a young kid. I knew a lot of the star players, and I always looked up to them. So, to now be on the team, is pretty special. It means a lot of play for Guelph."

Our player feature for this month, is Guelph native <u>Simon Chaves</u>. He attended Guelph Collegiate Vocational Institute (GCVI), a local secondary school known for producing great football players such as Jake Reinhart and Tavius Robinson. He initially chose the U of G because he was recruited for wrestling. Simon ended up having a good final year of Senior year of football, which opened up the opportunity to play for the Gryphons and be a dual athlete.

In a typical year, Simon would be busy with football in the Fall and then transition quickly into the wrestling season in October/November. He had a standout rookie year for wrestling in 2017, earning a 3rd place spot on the podium at the OUA championships. He went on to place 5th at USports Championships.

Technically, Simon's career as a student athlete at the U of G was supposed to end in 2021/2022. However, due to the pandemic, athletes did not lose a year of eligibility and, after having sustained an injury in the 2022 season, Simon is excited able to come back for one final season in 2023.

In the second game of the 2022 season and the 2nd punt return of the game, Simon suffered a torn ACL. He has been in recovery throughout the off-season and the coaches and his teammates were happy to have him back training on the field for Spring Camp.

"I've been working with Chris (DeZorzi - Team Physiotherapist) and the other staff throughout my recovery process and I am super thankful for their support and guidance. We've got such incredible facilities here at the Pavilion, it's convenient that I can do my strength workout, do some physical therapy, and utilize the tubs – it's all in one place."

Simon's first training camp in 2017 was right around the time that the new Pavilion opened. He used the old locker room during his first camp with the Gryphons, and since then has been able to take full advantage of all the resources, equipment, and facilities that are a part of the pavilion.

As one of our captains and a senior, Simon is always one to lead by example and volunteer his time to help out with community events, and various football initiatives. Most recently, Simon supported the Junior ID Camp by leading a few of the testing stations.

"It's important to get involved and help out the younger generation of football players. Beeks (<u>Jared Beeksma</u>), a Gryphon Alumni also came back to help and it was a full-circle moment for us because we attended that exact camp together in high-school. It's pretty neat to see the younger athletes walking through the stadium, testing out the equipment and working out in the gym. I hope they enjoyed their time at Alumni Stadium and use it as motivation to work hard and maybe they can be our #NextGryphon!"

Also in attendance at Junior ID Camp were former Gryphons <u>AJ Allen</u>, <u>Coulter Woodmansey</u> and <u>Eric Starczala</u>, who continued their playing career in the CFL. The CFL journey is one that Simon hopes to take on after this upcoming season.

Simon was signed to the Winnipeg Blue Bombers in 2022 and attended their camp last spring. He was let go on the last day of camp and was hoping to use the 2022 season as a year to get some better film. Of course, due to his ACL injury, that didn't happen, but he's motivated to have a strong performance in 2023.

When asked what he's most looking forward to for the upcoming season, Simon's answer was short and sweet: "Having a good year with the lads."

Thrilled to have you back in the lineup, Simon! All the best with your off-season training and we look forward to seeing you run out on the field at our home opener on August 26th.





FEATURED ALUMNUS

When kids are asked what they want to be when they grow up typical answers include: teacher, police office, doctor, or veterinarian. For those aspiring vets, they have their sights set on the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) at the University of Guelph. Did you know that OVC is the only vet school in Ontario and is <u>ranked</u> #3 in North America?

Our alumni feature, Nick Gallo, is a proud graduate from the Ontario Veterinary College, class of 2000. Nick joined the Gryphon squad in 1994 as a Linebacker and has been a very active alumni with our program ever since he graduated. He currently lives in Guelph, Ontario with his family and owns a veterinary practice.

"Being a U of G student was the best 5 years of my life. University was a great journey and being a part of the football team was a big reason for that, I have nothing but great memories. Looking back on it, I owe a lot to Gryphon Football, I was able to make lifelong friendships, and they are still a big part of my life today."

As a vet student, Nick had a very rigorous academic schedule. Class would start at 8am and run until 5pm, with a lunch break. It was a gruelling time, but well worth it, according to Gallo.

"My time at the U of G was definitely busy. I was balancing my football schedule and my class schedule. A typical day for me included 8 hours of class, heading to the stadium for football practice, heading home to do a few hours of homework and then I would do it all over again the next day. And I enjoyed being busy, I knew I had to go to class, I needed to get my workouts in, and I never thought of any alternatives. I enjoyed the challenges of being a student-athlete."

When conducing these interviews with alumni and players, something that always come up in conversation are any lessons that players learned, or the skillsets that they developed, and how these things impacted their personal growth. Whether alumni go into marketing, business, the trades, or healthcare – regardless of their career industry, the skills they developed in regard to time management or discipline, can be applied to their career.

"Football helped me to be a better vet, I truly believe that it didn't hold me back. Outside of your typical 'football knowledge' I learned a lot about what it meant to be being a part of a team, how to work with people, and how to be a teammate. As a veterinarian, I am in the service industry, and work with people every single day."

Gallo made an impact during his time as a Gryphon and was the recipient of the Ted Wildman Trophy in 1999.

"One of my favourite parts of the Wildman Event, is that the previous Wildman winners are invited to attend, and we get to officially welcome the newest inductee. It's a pretty special moment, because we all know what it takes to earn that honour. Not only do you have to be an excellent football player, but you must perform well academically, and that's hard to do, it takes a lot of discipline."


The Wildman Recipient in 2000 was none other than Jeremy Oxley, who just so happens to be the 2023 Honour Jersey recipient, who will be honoured at the upcoming gala on May 6th. Gallo and Oxley were teammates together at the U of G from 1996 – 1999.

"One word to describe Oxley is *dominant*, and that was evident the minute he stepped foot on campus. He was dominant his first year up until his last year and there was nobody like him. I was fortunate enough to play behind him as a linebacker and I didn't see a lot of offensive lineman come my way. The big guy ate up everybody and he made it easier for people playing around him, I don't think I was very good, he made me look good and I am sure the guys who played beside him would say the same thing. I can remember a moment from training camp in 1996. We were doing something called the Door Drill, which is for linemen, running backs and linebackers. The two linemen go against each other, with the running back and linebacker facing off. So, Oxley lines up, and he's a rookie and he was taking on a 3rd or 4th year lineman. I remember the big man goes out of his stance, grabs the OL man, tosses the OL to the side, grabs the running back and dumps him. The linebacker just stood there and was like 'what just happened?'. I had never seen that happen before, especially for rookies."

It's going to be a great night honouring Jeremy on May 6th at the Gala, and we look forward to hearing more stories from his teammates! Thank you, Nick for taking the time to chat with us and for sharing some memories from your time as a Gryphon!

GUELPH GRYPHONS






Guelph is also building up good quarterback steam, with veteran Brad Hall and ex-US Colle quarterback Craig Conklin.

The main question to be answered here is 'Can the rookie contingent support the seasoned veterans and carry the play?"








